Fully Vaccinated International Travelers

Here are the steps to follow when traveling back to Canada.

First step:

- Complete this <u>questionnaire</u> on the Canadian Government website before they travel. The questionnaire applies to both fully vaccinated and unvaccinated International Travelers. When completing the above <u>questionnaire</u> please ensure that you select the answer that pertains to your situation.
- Upon completion, you will be informed on whether or not you can travel to Canada. A reminder that entry to Canada is determined by border agents.



- a combination of at least 2 doses of the above vaccines
- $^{\bigcirc}$ unable to receive a COVID-19 vaccination for medical reasons
- $^{\bigcirc}$ none of the above (unvaccinated, single dose in a two-dose regimen, recovered)

Find out if you can travel to Canada - Foreign national vaccination date





This timing is only required for your second dose or your first dose of J&J, not for third or fourth boosters.

If you answer "NO", please follow the instruction for unvaccinated travelers as outlined in <u>Steps for Unvaccinated International Travelers</u> (PDF).

If you answer "YES", please see example below, but your individual situation may vary based on your answers. You may be asked to complete further steps such as testing, etc. Please note the types of tests that may be required and the timing for providing test results to the government before entering Canada.

Find out if you can travel to Canada – Foreign vaccinated

You indicated that you are:

- a foreign national
- qualified for fully vaccinated status in Canada

Based on your answers, you will **likely be allowed to enter Canada**; however, the final determination will be made by a government official at the port of entry.

What you need to do next

To enter, you need to qualify as a fully vaccinated traveller:

- To qualify, follow the checklist of what you need to have ready at the border
- your ArriveCAN receipt must have the letter I, V, or A beside your name
- Follow the <u>requirements for children accompanying you</u>
- Unless you are a citizen of the United States, find out if you need a visa or Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA)

Upon your entry, the border services officer may notify you that you've been <u>randomly selected for a mandatory arrival</u> <u>test:</u>

• you may be exempt from being selected for arrival testing if you bring <u>valid proof of a prior positive molecular test</u> result, taken at least 10 calendar days and no more than 180 calendar days before entering Canada.

You may also qualify for the exemption from randomized arrival testing if the purpose of your travel is related to these and <u>other special situations</u>:

- frequent cross-border services
- essential services, trade and transportation
- medical support or treatment

Second step:

Once CCNM receives your completed forms, Student Services can advise you further.

<u>ArriveCAN</u> continues to be mandatory for all travellers to Canada. It is also required to qualify for the fully vaccinated traveller exemption from quarantine and testing. All steps mentioned above are required.
