

Unvaccinated International Travelers

Here are the steps to follow when traveling back to Canada.

First step:

- Complete this [questionnaire](#) on the Canadian Government website before you travel. The questionnaire applies to both fully vaccinated and unvaccinated International Travelers. When completing the above [questionnaire](#) please ensure that you select the answer that pertains to your situation.
- Upon completion, you will be informed on whether or not you can travel to Canada. A reminder that entry to Canada is determined by border agent.

Find out if you can travel to Canada - Foreign national vaccine

You indicated that you are:

- a foreign national

* Have you received at least 2 COVID-19 vaccine doses or a combination of at least 2 doses? Select the option that best fits your situation: (required)

- AstraZeneca/COVISHIELD (ChAdOx1-S, Vaxzevria, AZD1222)
- Bharat Biotech (Covaxin, BBV152 A, B, C)
- Janssen/Johnson & Johnson – 1 dose
- Medicago Covifenz
- Moderna (Spikevax, mRNA-1273) including for children aged 6 months to 11 years
- Novavax (NVX-COV2373, Nuvaxovid, Covovax)
- Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty, tozinameran, BNT162b2) including for children aged 5 to 11 years
- Sinopharm BIBP (BBIBP-CorV)
- Sinovac (CoronaVac, PiCoVacc)
- a combination of at least 2 doses of the above vaccines
- unable to receive a COVID-19 vaccination for medical reasons
- none of the above (unvaccinated, single dose in a two-dose regimen, recovered)

The next question will ask you “Which best describes you or your primary reason to entry into Canada?”

Here you will answer “*under age 18*”

Find out if you can travel to Canada - Foreign national

You indicated that you are:

- a foreign national
- not qualified as a fully vaccinated traveller

* Which best describes you or your primary reason for entry into Canada? (required)

- under age 18
- crossing to or from border communities for work or everyday functions
- passing through Canada to another country
- temporary foreign worker (farming or food processing only)
- approved permanent resident (who has not yet arrived in Canada)
- receiving essential medical services or treatments (for a condition other than COVID-19)
- compassionate reasons (funerals, caring for or visiting critically ill)
- work: deliver, install, maintain or repair critical infrastructure or medical necessary supplies, equipment or devices
- marine crew, including commercial fishing vessels
- diplomat or their immediate family members
- French citizen of Saint-Pierre-et-Miquelon
- Ukrainian citizen or a family member of a Ukrainian citizen
- none of the above (other reasons, tourism, work, business travel)

Next, you will be asked “Which best describes your travel plan?”
Here you will answer “travel to Canada to study as an international student”

Find out if you can travel to Canada – Foreign national - Student

You indicated that you are:
• a foreign national
• an international student

To be able to enter Canada, you must have a valid study permit, and the school you're attending must be considered a designated learning institution (DLI) with a COVID-19 readiness plan approved by its province or territory.

You will likely be allowed to enter Canada if you meet these requirements; however, the final determination will be made by a government official at the port of entry.

What you need to do next

- check that your school is a designated learning institution (DLI) with a COVID-19 readiness plan
- bring your valid study permit (or proof of the approval)
- bring a valid letter of acceptance from a designated learning institution (DLI) on the approved list
- bring proof that you have enough money to support yourself and any family members who come with you to Canada
- use ArriveCAN to submit your information
- if you will be 17 years old or younger when you arrive, you must follow the checklist of pre-entry testing and quarantine requirements
- if you will be 18 years or older when you arrive, you must qualify as a fully vaccinated traveller to enter Canada.
- Exemptions for daily or regular cross-border students and people driving them

- ▶ Students travelling with immediate family
- ▶ Students in a health field: quarantine exemptions

This answer does not guarantee entry into Canada

Please note that once you arrive in Canada you would still need to adhere to the guidelines as indicated on the [Government website](#), as you may meet the requirements of an **“Unvaccinated International Traveler”**.

You will need to ensure that you have a safe and secure location to complete your 14-Day Quarantine. If you **do not** have a Quarantine location, Student Services can advise you of the designated hotel for our International Students.

Second step:

- Review and complete **ALL** forms via the CCNM International Student webpage (see links below) for College compliance.
